





The Peace of Purpose

PROVERBS 19:21

BRO. MARCUS T. WATKINS

Central Text

Proverbs 19:21: "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will prevail." It teaches that while people naturally make many plans, true peace comes only when those plans align with God's singular, sovereign purpose.

Key Points

- Plans vs. Purpose:** God is not against planning, but human plans—formed from limited perspective, fear, or desire—often fail to bring peace. When plans are disconnected from God's purpose, they produce anxiety, frustration, and restlessness. Peace comes from trusting God's purpose, not controlling outcomes.
- Anxiety as a Warning Sign:** Ongoing anxiety may signal that we are fighting for our own plans instead of surrendering to God's will. Whenever peace is missing, it's time to examine what we're holding onto that God may be asking us to release.
- Purpose Is a Person to Trust:** God's purpose is not a puzzle to solve but a path to walk. God often reveals purpose step by step, requiring faith rather than full understanding.
- The Problem of Presumption:** We often presume our plans are God's plans. Even good, moral, or spiritual desires may not align with God's purpose. Therefore, prayers should always end with, "Not my will, but Your will be done."
- God Cares More About Conformity Than Comfort:** God's goal is not our comfort but our transformation into the image of Christ. Discomfort, loss, and struggle are often tools God uses to shape character and maturity.
- God's Purpose Is Singular and Unstoppable:** While we juggle many plans, God has one definitive purpose for each life. God has no "Plan B." His purpose is eternal, unbreakable, and will prevail despite obstacles, failures, detours, or disobedience.
- Peace Comes From Acceptance:** Peace is not the absence of storms but confidence in the God who controls them. When we stop fighting God and accept His purpose, peace follows—even in hardship.
- Relationships and Purpose:** Some people cannot go with you into God's purpose. It may be necessary to release relationships that distract or discourage obedience to God's calling.
